Federal Funding:
21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) Program

1994: 21st CCLC Launched

The 21st CCLC was launched. The first grants were awarded in 1995.

2002: Block Grants to States

No Child Left Behind Act reauthorized 21st CCLC, transferring administration of the grants to state education agencies.

\$121.6 Million

2002: Prop 49 Passed

Current Funding Allocation

\$550 Million

1997: SB 1756 Passed

First allocation of state funding for school based After School Programs.

\$50 Million

2006: Prop 49 Triggered

Prop 49 was triggered when CA reached \$1.5 Billion more in state spending than the highest spending year between 2000-2004.
