## Chronic Absenteeism Indicator



On the California School Dashboard (Dashboard), local educational agencies (LEAs) and schools that serve transitional kindergarten through grade eight students receive a Chronic Absenteeism Indicator based on the number of students who were absent 10 percent or more of the school year.

For most state indicators, the desired outcome is to have a high percentage of performance in the current year. However, chronic absenteeism has a reverse goal of having the lowest percentage of students chronically absent in the current year.

Note: This indicator is not reported for high schools. However, chronic absenteeism rates for all grade levels (transitional kindergarten through grade twelve) and absenteeism by reason can be accessed through the <u>California Department of Education (CDE) Absenteeism Data web page</u>.

- \* Students must be enrolled for at least 31 instructional days to be counted in the numerator or denominator.
- \*\* Chronic absenteeism rate is used to determine the Status level for this indicator.

## **Comparing Current and Prior Year Data**

We compare current and prior year data to see whether a school or district made improvement (i.e., had a lower rate of chronic absenteeism in 2024 than it did in 2023) or did worse (i.e., had a higher rate in 2024).
